 Professor Iram Siraj, OBE Emeritus Professor, Senior Research Fellow at Jesus College, University of Oxford, Distinguished Visiting Research Professor at University of Maynooth, Ireland and Honorary Visiting Professor, Melbourne University	An internationally recognised expert in early childhood education, Professor Iram Siraj OBE has led pioneering research on early learning, teaching quality and educational leadership. She was NIE's inaugural Lee Sing Kong Professor in Early Childhood Education in 2023 and has participated in academic engagements in Singapore. Professor Iram chairs the Technical Expert Group for the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) International Early Learning and Child Well-being Study (2017–2026) and developed internationally used rating scales to assess and improve early years practice. She has also advised government agencies and international organisations, including United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the World Bank.



Professor Jane Page OAM

Associate Director of the REEaCh Centre (Research in Effective Education in Early Childhood), Faculty of Education at University of Melbourne

Professor Jane Page OAM brings more than four decades of experience across early childhood teaching, leadership and research. She previously taught in the Bachelor of Early Childhood Studies (International) programme, a joint initiative between the University of Melbourne and the Singapore Institute of Management.

Professor Jane's research focuses on driving high-quality early childhood education and equitable learning outcomes for children. She has led projects with national and state governments, including developing professional learning interventions, co-designing a Continuity of Learning Framework, a Transitions Position Statement, and an Early Years Learning and Assessment Tool (EYALT), and was a member of the national consortia Australian Learning Frameworks Update.



Professor Mugyeong Moon

Senior Research Fellow, Education Research Institute, Seoul National University, Academic Research Professor, Kyung Hee University and Emeritus Research Fellow, Korea Institute of Child Care and Education, Seoul, Korea

Professor Mugyeong Moon served for two decades at the Korea Institute of Child Care and Education (KICCE), including as Director of International Research and Data Analysis, contributing to major Korean government policy initiatives such as national five-year Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC) plans, curriculum development, and kindergarten and childcare evaluation. She was actively engaged in the OECD ECEC Network for over 20 years as Korea's national coordinator and Vice-Chair.

Professor Moon has also contributed to UNESCO, Asia-Pacific Regional Network for Early Childhood (ARNEC), Pacific Early Childhood Education Research Association (PECERA), and regional initiatives, including the Southeast Asian Early Childhood Care and Education Teacher Competency Framework. Her recent research focuses on ECEC integration, climate and digital policy, play-based curriculum and international early childhood development cooperation.

Associate Professor Yang Weipeng's research focuses on empowering children and educators to use artificial intelligence (AI) and digital technologies ethically and effectively. His work also examines the design and evaluation of culturally and developmentally appropriate AI tools, as well as innovations in early childhood curriculum.

Associate Professor Yang previously lectured at the Singapore University of Social Sciences. He has served as Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Research in Childhood Education and currently holds editorial roles with the *British Journal of Educational Technology*, *Early Childhood Research Quarterly*, *AI, Brain and Child*, and the *Journal for the Study of Education and Development*. He is a member of the British Curriculum Forum (BCF) Steering Group.
