

Diversionary programmes are available for youth who have committed minor offences to divert them from the criminal iustice system. These programmes help to rehabilitate and reintegrate such youth, and free up Court resources for youth with higher likelihood of reoffending.

ENHANCED STREETWISE PROGRAMME

Comprises series of individual, group-based and family sessions: regular and in-person reporting to the Singapore Police Force; and restriction on places and people the youth may access



MERITS OF PRE-COURT DIVERSION



Rehabilitate youth offenders based on their differing risks and needs



Avoid stigmatisation of being exposed to the criminal justice system at a young age



Free up Court resources, to support rehabilitation of youth offenders with higher risk of reoffending



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
