## Singapore: **NURTURING** and **ENDEARING** home

Each and every child: **SAFE** and **SECURE**, with the **OPPORTUNITY** to fulfil his dreams

#### A GOOD START

- Early childhood: Quadrupling Government spending and more than doubling full-day preschool places between 2012 and 2023
- Education: No Singaporean is denied schooling because of financial difficulty
- More support for low-income: KidSTART and UPLIFT as key interventions for young children and their families

#### SUPPORT FOR VULNERABLE CHILDREN

- Low income: SGD 131 million (USD 92 million) disbursed in 2017 under the ComCare fund
- Children with developmental and special education needs: Extension of Compulsory Education Act to children with special education needs from Jan 2019; 30% increase in spending in 2019 to enhance Early Intervention programmes
- Children in need of care and protection: We are working towards raising the age limit under the Children and Young Persons Act from 16 to 18 years; New offences against sexual exploitation of children and child abuse materials introduced in the Penal Code
- Youth justice: Minimum Age of Criminal Responsibility in the Penal Code raised from 7 to 10 years

#### A NURTURING **ENVIRONMENT WHERE** CHILDREN CAN THRIVE

- Support for parents: Legislated parental leave; Integrated access to resources and services through Moments of Life and Baby Bonus
- Family bonding: Families For Life Council; FamilyMatters!
- Reduced school stress: Revamped examination regime and phased removal of streaming in schools
- Better health outcomes: NurtureSG action plan

### PARTNERING NGOS TO CREATE STRONGER COMMUNITIES AND SUPPORT **NETWORKS**

- Caring and active citizenry: Stakeholders consulted on policy and legislative reviews; Multiple channels of feedback available
- NGOs provide accessible and people-centric social services: Community partners such as Family Service Centres, Child Protection and Family Violence Specialist Centres work with families
