

Optional Protocol on

Involvement of Children in Armed Conflict

Article 1

Children can't take a direct part in hostilities if they are a member of the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF) and under 18 years old



Article 2

Children are not obliged to join the SAF if they are under 18 years old.



Children under 18 years old and not below 16½ years old may volunteer out of their own free will to enlist in the SAF, but only with their parents' or legal guardian's permission.



The government is responsible to prevent armed groups that are not part of the SAF from recruiting children below 18 years old.



Article **5**

The government is responsible for ensuring that children's rights under this Protocol are protected. The government is responsible to publicise the principles and provisions of the Protocol to both adults and children.





Article **7**

The government should work together with the governments of other countries (who are parties to the Protocol) to protect children from any activity that goes against the Protocol. Children who have been harmed by any activity that goes against the Protocol should be helped in their recovery.
