Active Implementation framework

Proposed by the National Implementation Research Network (NIRN)



Provides guidance for putting evidence-based programmes into practice



Outlines 4 implementation phases



Which Implementation Phase am I in?

START!

I am **considering** implementing a new programme

I have already **chosen** a new programme!

I have **begun** to implement the new programme

Most of my team members are implementing the new programme **with fidelity**

Degree to which programme is delivered as intended

1 I am in... **EXPLORATION**

When the team is considering a new programme



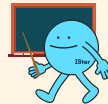
2 I am in... **INSTALLATION**

When the team has selected a programme but has not implemented it



3 I am in... **INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION**

When the team has started implementation but is still learning to deliver the programme



4 I am in... **FULL IMPLEMENTATION**

When majority of the team is delivering the programme with fidelity
