

NEEDS ANALYSIS (II)



Now that you have been introduced to a Needs Analysis, let's look at how you can conduct a Needs Analysis!





Who will use the results?

🥄 What are your resources?

Who are the stakeholders involved?

Who will be the decision makers?



Determine assessment criteria



Develop a set of clear criteria that are adapted to your context



To evaluate different needs and determine which to prioritise



Collect, analyse and present data



Consider what to present to decision makers and how to synthesise data



Identify data to collect (e.g. quantitative or qualitative)



Identify existing sources of data



Develop a plan for data collection and analysis



Apply the criteria and prioritise needs



2=

Determine decision-making strategy to assess and prioritise needs (e.g. ranking and rating)



Meet with decision-making group and apply criteria



Identify next steps and report back



Research further on prioritised needs and explore evidence for effective interventions



Report findings from needs analysis and follow-up actions to stakeholders
